Haiti Update

Thursday - Evening - October 6, 2016

Current plans are to leave for the SA Airport early on Friday morning, spend Friday night in Ft Lauderdale, and arrive in Port-au-Prince on Saturday morning. According to the schedule, we will miss Hurricane Matthew and other storm clouds that are floating around. We never put much faith in weather forecasts, but we always check them.

I plan on returning on October 15. Helen will be meeting a medical team that is coming in on the plane I am leaving on and will stay another week.

Before Matthew hit, we heard that the orphans from the Faith Lutheran Orphanage were moved to the second floor of Faith Lutheran Church in Gonaives. We have not heard anything since Matthew arrived.

The Port-au-Prince Airport reopened for business on Wednesday, October 5. With relief supplies coming in, the airport is very busy.

I heard from Newton Michel yesterday. We met at a Monolithic Dome workshop. He lives not far from San Marc and reports that he is doing OK. He wrote, "At this time, I do not know people who suffered disaster caused by Hurricane Matthew (communication is lost with Grand'Anse and a big part of South Department. But it is sure there's a lot of roofs stolen by winds."

This morning I heard from Lophane. He and his family are OK.

I'll be taking my supply of *Kay pou Jubilee* books. We will not be using them on this trip, but Lophane will have them and will start distributing them before we head back in December.

Our plans for December are to finish the Candice Dominguez Girls' Dorm and build one home in Jubilee. If we can get the details worked out, Candice will come for the dedication just before Christmas. If a few more details are worked out, she will bring her family.

As all of you know who have "interesting life styles," it is support and understanding from the spouse that allows us to go out and do what we do. Keep Judy, and Helen's husband, Lloyd, in your prayers.

Communication back to the states will not be as good as it has been on past trips when we have complained about how bad it was. When I can get a report sent out, I will send it to Alice Klement at Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran. She will edit it and pass it out to those on the church mailing list. If I do not get a report to her, she has my permission to fabricate one.
